Post Graduate Department of Education

Attainment of Programme Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes and Course Outcomes

The Post Graduate Department of Education measured course outcomes on the basis of conducting unit-wise test papers for all courses on completion of each unit. Students are given assignments and they have to make presentations in addition to timely submission of assignments. Instant Quizzes are also held to evaluate their general awareness and knowledge in the subject based on current issues. Pre University examinations are conducted at the Departmental level for each course. End semester examinations are conducted at the university level. The high performance of students in these assessments testifies the good achievement in the course outcomes.

In order to evaluate Programme Specific Outcomes, Students have under take research project (dissertation) on the burning issues in the field of education at the end of fourth semester. Under the guidance of teachers, they have to prepare the different research tools for data collection. Students have to collect and analyze the data using advanced statistical softwares and submit the project reports. Research report presentations are done under the guidance of experts which helps the students to become aware of recent research developments. This enables them to prepare research papers and publish in reputed Journals. Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO) is well analyzed by these testing tools.

The Programme outcomes of the Post Graduate Department of Education are measured by the achievement of the students in university examinations. Almost 98% students of the Post Graduate Department of Education have qualified University examination in first division. Also, the programme outcomes(POs) is evaluated on the basis of the performance of students in the UGC/CSIR NET-JRF examinations. More than 13 students of the Postgraduate Department of Education have qualified in the UGC/CSIR NET-JRF examinations during the past years.
