Attainment

In order to measure course outcomes, the Women's Studies Department conducts unit-wise test papers for all courses during each month on completion of each unit. Department organises Various intra class writing activities to attain the outcomes. Students of the department visits nearby institutes and NGOs working on women's issues to see implementation of the curriculum outcomes. Students are given assignments and have to submit on Google classroom. The students have practical work and assignments to be submitted on each theory and practical papers. Seminars are also conducted and submission of seminar papers. Surprise test and Term exams are also conducted on the completion of teaching syllabus. The high performance of students in these assessments testifies the good achievement in the Course Outcome.

In order to evaluate Programme Specific Outcomes, performance of the Women's Studies students is checked through their active participation as learners in the societal gender sensitization. Class room teaching and timely extra-curricular activities are another method through which PSO are evaluated. Subject Specific quiz and debate competitions at university level provide platforms to attain and evaluate PSO. Students are also promoted to read news and other happenings around through gender perspective. A special focus on developing research abilities is given which is evaluated through small writing works from students. Presentation through viva also followed to evaluate PSO.

Teacher's combine timely interactions at the department to evaluate PO is a method we follow. It helps us to know teaching and learning level through democratic environment to attain PO. Question asking abilities of the students is checked to evaluate PO. We also visit and establish dialogues with the social work institutes, government and private agencies where our students visit to learn gender perspective, through this we evaluate their involvement in the program. related to the women and child development sectors. We evaluate PO through feedbacks taken from the students.
